

# Canadian Off-Road Championship Series

This is an overview of the Canadian Off-Road Championship Series. It has been created to bring a national structure to Canada's off-road racing. These are supplemental requirements that really have no place in the rule book, but are needed.

### REGIONS:

The following are the proposed regions for Canada. These are just proposed at this time, although AB and BC have agreed to their regions.

British Columbia  
Alberta  
Saskatchewan/Manitoba  
Ontario  
Quebec  
Maritime Provinces

Each region is in control of their individual series, ie number of clubs, points scoring, scheduling etc.

The rulebook has been created to bring consistency to all racing in the series and at the National Championship. All rules are to be followed as per the book. If there are any issues with the rules they must be addressed prior to Jan.01 of each year. After that date the rulebook stands as is for that year.

Membership to CORCS is \$5 per year. At each CORCS event a fee of \$5 per driver is required to go to the CORCS general fund. The fund will be used for any need of the series, as deemed appropriate by the directors. The balance at the end of the year will be donated to charity.

Each paid member of CORCS that has raced a minimum of 2 CORCS **series** races will be eligible for voting on any changes or issues that may arise. Voting will be conducted on-line at [www.corcs.ca](http://www.corcs.ca)

Any host/facility that is in violation of any CORCS rules will be fined \$100 per incident. This is to be paid to the CORCS general fund. If the fines are not paid, that facility/host will not be allowed to run a CORCS event until it is paid.

Each year on the September long weekend, there will be a **CORCS National Championship** held. This event is open to any racer with a CORCS membership. The order of rotation of the Nationals will be Calgary(2006), Vancouver(2007), Edmonton(2008), Kamloops(2009), and Medicine Hat(2010)(at this time). The nationals are to be rotated from region to region each year. If a region is not able to or willing to host the nationals, then the next region in line will get the nationals. The region that passes on the race, will be put next in line for the following year.

Entry fees at all CORCS races are to be \$35 for the first class, and \$20 for each additional class.
